

# JUDGE CINDERELA R. GUEVARA



## PRESS RELEASE

Reference: COVID-19 Novel Coronavirus, Presidio County

On Thursday, June 25, the Department of State Health Services informed Presidio County Judge Cinderela Guevara of three new cases in Presidio County, bringing the total cases to 13 confirmed and 4 probable's. The new cases, numbers 11, 12 and 13, range in age from 19 to 50's.

The state's COVID case tracking website currently reflects the ten previously confirmed cases, plus the 4 probable's, reading 14 total, which a regional DSHS official confirmed to the Judge.

All the patients are currently isolated. DSHS is supporting Presidio County in identifying any close contacts so they can be isolated and monitored for symptoms.

The Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) Public Health Region 9/10 is reminding the public that it is conducting contact investigation on persons who have tested positive to determine possible exposure to others. If the health department has not contacted you, there is no need to take any action at this time.



In order to share facts and not fear, we continue to emphasize the importance of prevention and there are simple steps everyone can take to help prevent spreading the virus:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- If soap and water are not available, use a 60% alcohol-based handsanitizer.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Practice social distancing by staying at least six feet away
- Stay at home and stop the spread of coronavirus
