

**ORDER BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF PRESIDIO COUNTY,
TEXAS CALLING AN ELECTION TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE
OF CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION TO BE HELD WITHIN SAID
COUNTY; MAKING PROVISIONS FOR THE CONDUCT AND THE
GIVING OF NOTICE OF THE ELECTION; AND CONTAINING OTHER
PROVISIONS RELATING THERETO.**

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court (the “Commissioners Court”) of Presidio County, Texas (the “County”), approved a notice of its intention (the “Notice”) to issue certificates of obligation pursuant to Subchapter C, Chapter 271, Texas Local Government Code, as amended, on June 11, 2025; and

WHEREAS, following publication of the Notice, the Presidio County Clerk received a petition signed by at least five percent of the qualified voters of the County protesting the issuance of such certificates before the date tentatively set for the authorization of the issuance of the certificates; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 271.049, Texas Local Government Code, as amended, if before the date tentatively set for the authorization of the issuance of the certificates of obligation or if before the authorization, the county clerk receives a petition signed by at least five percent of the qualified voters of the county protesting the issuance of the certificates of obligation, the County may not authorize the issuance of the certificates unless the issuance is approved at an election ordered, held, and conducted in the manner provided for bond elections under Chapter 1251, Texas Government Code, as amended; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 271.049(c), Texas Local Government Code, as amended, the Commissioners Court finds and determines that it is necessary and advisable to call and hold an election for and within the County to determine whether the County may issue the certificates of obligation for the purposes set forth in the Notice (the “Election”) and as described in the proposition hereinafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court hereby finds and determines that said election shall be held on a uniform election date established by Section 41.001(a), Texas Election Code, as amended, as required by Texas law; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court finds, determines, and declares that the meeting at which this Order is considered is open to the public as required by law, and that the public notice of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting was given, as required by Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF PRESIDIO COUNTY, TEXAS:

Section 1. Findings. The statements contained in the preamble of this Order are true and correct and are hereby adopted as findings of fact and as a part of the operative provisions hereof.

Section 2. Election Ordered: Date: Propositions. The Election shall be held for and within the County on Tuesday, November 4, 2025 (“Election Day”), a uniform election date

ADA accessibility, beautification, utility relocations, drainage, and irrigation, (iii) acquiring materials, supplies, equipment, vehicles, and machinery for County road and bridge purposes, and (iv) professional services rendered in relation to such projects and the financing thereof, and the levying of a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the certificates of obligation.

Section 4. Multilingual Election Materials. All notices, instructions, and ballots pertaining to the Election shall be furnished to voters in English and Spanish in compliance with the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended (the "Voting Rights Act"), and the Code, including particularly Chapter 272 of the Code pertaining to bilingual requirements.

Section 5. Persons Qualified to Vote. All resident, qualified voters of the County shall be eligible to vote at the Election.

Section 6. Election Precincts, Voting Locations, and Voting Hours on Election Day. The polling places for the Election are hereby designated to be those locations identified by Carolina Catano, the Presidio County Clerk (the "County Clerk"). Voting on Election Day shall be conducted at the countywide polling locations designated on Exhibit A attached hereto, with such locations being incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof for all purposes; provided, however, such locations may be changed if so directed by the County Clerk without further action by the Commissioners Court and without amendment of this Order. The County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to make such changes in precinct numbers and polling locations as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Election, without further action by the Commissioners Court and without amendment of this Order, and the County Judge or his designee is hereby authorized to update Exhibit A to reflect the locations designated by the County Clerk, which locations are hereby approved. Each polling place shall be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Section 7. Early Voting Clerk; Early Voting Locations, Dates, and Times. (a) The County Clerk is hereby appointed as Early Voting Clerk for the election. Deputy early voting judges/clerks will be appointed as needed to process early voting mail and to conduct early voting. Early voting by mail shall be conducted in conformance with the requirements of the Code. The County Clerk is hereby authorized to appoint the members of the Early Voting Ballot Board and the presiding judges and alternate judges in accordance with the requirements of the Code and/or by separate order of the Commissioners Court. Early voting shall be conducted by the Early Voting Clerk, at the main early voting polling location listed below; provided, such location may be changed or additional early voting locations may be added by the County Clerk, without further action of the Commissioners Court and without amendment of this Order, as is necessary for the proper conduct of the Election.

(b) The address for the Early Voting Clerk and the address for application for ballot by mail (ABBM) is Carolina A. Cataño, Presidio County Clerk, P.O. Box 789, Marfa, Texas 79843, and the Early Voting Clerk may be reached at the following: (i) Telephone: 432-729-4812 or 432-729-3857, (ii) Email: carolina.catano@co.presidio.tx.us, and (iii) Website: www.co.presidio.tx.us.

(c) Applications for ballot by mail ("ABBM") shall be submitted to the Presidio County Clerk, P.O. Box 789, Marfa, Texas 79843; or in person by the individual voter or by common or contract carrier to Presidio County Clerk's Office, 300 N. Highland Ave., Marfa,


TX 79843; by fax to 432-729-4313; or by electronic submission to carolina.catano@co.presidio.tx.us. An ABBM must be **received** (not post-marked) no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m. Central Time) on Friday, October 24, 2025. If an ABBM is faxed or emailed, then the applicant must submit the **original** application **by mail** to the early voting clerk so that the early voting clerk receives the original no later than the 4th business day after receiving the emailed or faxed ABBM. If the early voting clerk does not receive the original ABBM by that deadline, then the emailed or faxed ABBM will be considered incomplete, and the early voting clerk may NOT send the applicant a ballot.

(d) The main early voting polling place for the County is hereby designated to be the Presidio County Annex, Building B, 300 E. O'Reilly St., Presidio, TX 79845 and Marfa Volunteer Fire Station, 106 E. Lincoln St., Marfa, TX 79843.

(e) Early voting by personal appearance for all election precincts shall be held at the locations, at the times and on the days set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein, or at such other locations, times, and days as hereafter may be designated by the County Clerk, without further action by the Commissioners Court and without amendment of this Order. The County Judge or his designee is hereby authorized to update Exhibit A to reflect the locations and times designated by the County Clerk, and such locations are hereby approved.

(f) The Voting Clerk is hereby authorized to appoint the members of the early voting ballot board and the presiding judges and alternate judges for each polling location in accordance with the requirements of the Code. Each of the presiding judges shall be authorized to approve the necessary election clerks to assist in conducting the Election.

(g) Voting times may be changed if so directed by the County Clerk without further action of the Commissioners Court and without amendment of this Order. The County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to make such changes in voting hours as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Election.

 Section 8. Notice of Election. Notice of the Election shall be given by: (i) publishing notice of the Election, in English and Spanish, two times on the same day in consecutive weeks, with the first publication occurring not earlier than the thirtieth day or later than fourteen days prior to Election Day, in a newspaper published in the County, or, in the absence of such newspaper, in a newspaper of general circulation within the County (or that otherwise complies with applicable law), (ii) posting a copy of this Order and the Voter Information Document (pursuant to Sec. 1251.052(b) of the Local Government Code), in English and Spanish, in the County courthouse and annex on the bulletin board used for posting notices and in at least three other public places within the boundaries of the County, not later than the twenty-first day prior to the date set for the Election, and (iii) posting a copy of this Order and the Voter Information Document, in English and Spanish, on the County's website, prominently and together with the notice of the Election, the contents of the Proposition and any sample ballot prepared for the Election, not later than the twenty-first day prior to the date set for the Election through Election Day. Additionally, on Election Day and during early voting by personal appearance, this Order and the Voter Information Document shall be posted in a prominent location at each polling place. Notice of the Election shall also be posted to the County's internet website not later than the twenty-first day before the election, in compliance with Section 4.009, Texas Election Code, as amended. The website for the County can be found at www.co.presidio.tx.us.

Section 9. Conduct of Election. The Election shall be held in accordance with the Code, the Texas Government Code, and the Voting Rights Act, including particularly Chapter 272 of the Code pertaining to bilingual requirements.

Section 10. Information Required by Section 3.009 of the Election Code. (a) In accordance with Section 3.009(b)(5) and (7) through (9) of the Code, the County, as of the date of the adoption of this Order, had outstanding an aggregate principal amount of debt equal to \$1,407,000; the aggregate amount of the interest owed on such County debt obligations, through respective maturity, totaled \$584,709.50; and the County levied an ad valorem debt service tax rate for its outstanding debt obligations of \$0.00441 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation. Based on the bond market conditions on the date of the adoption of this Order, the maximum interest rate for any series of certificates of obligation authorized at the Election is projected to be 6.00% (expressed as a net effective interest rate applicable to any such series of certificates of obligation). The foregoing estimated interest rate is only an estimate, provided for Texas statutory compliance, and does not serve as a cap on the interest rate for the certificates of obligation that are the subject of the Election. The maximum maturity date of the certificates of obligation that are the subject of this Election is February 15, 2045.

(c) The additional information required by Section 3.009 of the Code is located in Sections 2 and 3 of this Order.

Section 11. Voter Information Document. The County Judge, or his designee, acting on behalf of the Commissioners Court, is further authorized and directed to post or provide for the posting of the Voter Information Document in the manner provided under Section 8 of this Order, and additionally on the County's website in an easily accessible manner beginning not later than the twenty-first day before the date set for the Election and ending on the day after Election Day.

Section 12. Necessary Actions. The County Judge and the County Clerk, or such person's designee, acting on behalf of the Commissioners Court, in consultation with the County Attorney and bond counsel are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions necessary to comply with the provisions of the Code and the Voting Rights Act in carrying out and conducting the Election, whether or not expressly authorized herein, including making changes or additions to polling places or procedures to the extent required or desirable as determined by the County Clerk or as may become necessary due to circumstances arising after the date of this Order.

Section 13. Severability. If any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Order, or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid, or unenforceable, neither the remaining portions of this Order nor their application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall be affected thereby, it being the intent of the Commissioners Court in adopting this Order that no portion hereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality, voidness, invalidity, or unenforceability of any other portion hereof, and all provisions of this Order are declared to be severable for that purpose.

Section 14. Effective Date. This Order shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.


